A URIE rebuild of a Drummond "T9," this model represents one of the last batch of 15 locomotives which were built with the wide splashers, and cab, contrasting with the earlier two batches with coupling rod splashers.

This "S" gauge ($\frac{3}{16}$ in. to 1 ft scale, $\frac{7}{8}$ in. gauge) model was constructed by Bernard Wright (Wimbledon M.R.C. and "S" Gauge Society) of nickel silver and brass. It has adapted "OO" gauge wheels, a Zenith mechanism, full cab fittings and is rigged for stud contact pick-up.

Together with the Drummond "water cart" tender, it is finished in Southern livery of the mid-thirties with Rond's paints (sprayed)
